Kirkin' o' the Tartans & the MSS Annual Meeting & Elections

The Montreat Scottish Society will hold its 24th annual Kirkin' o' the Tartan on Sunday, May 29th, at 11 a.m. in Anderson Auditorium, Montreat. Nearly 2,000 people attend this annual event — one of the largest Kirkins in the U.S.

The Rev. James Wood, founder of the Wears Valley Ranch for children in Sevierville, TN, will be the guest minister at the service.

In the U.S., the Kirkin' service originated with Peter Marshall.

Legend is that that when the tartan was banned in 1745, clansmen would bring a small concealed tartan to the Kirk (church) for a annual blessing. Today, Kirkins are a time for wearing family tartans to church.

The Montreat Scottish Pipe & Drum Band will play a Pipin' on the Green, prior to the service, beginning around 10:15 a.m.

Individuals wishing to carry a tartan banner during the service must arrive at Anderson Auditorium by 10:15 a.m. to claim a banner. No banners are being reserved this year for specific individuals or donors. The Society has more than 130 tartan banners.

The offering from the service is donated, after expenses, to the Montreat Conference Center for its various projects.
